The European Universities alliances are a flagship initiative of the European strategy for universities. They encompass 65 European Universities alliances with more than 570 higher education institutions of all types, from all across Europe.

The initiative is an ambitious EU project aimed at establishing alliances between higher institutions from all across Europe, for the benefit of their students, staff and society. It is implemented primarily through Erasmus+ funding.

By developing long-term structural and strategic and sustainable cooperation between the higher education institutions in the European Universities alliances, the initiative aims to

- improve the international competitiveness of higher education institutions in Europe
- promote European values and identity

Through these alliances students can get a degree by combining studies in several European countries. The initiative has the potential to bring greater benefits to higher education institutions than any previous cooperation projects.

In Slovakia, there are 8 universities as proud members of one of European Universities alliances currently. They as well as the whole higher education sector in Slovakia clearly thrive from this membership as the internationalization processes are more widely and intensively introduced into the higher education sector.



The EMERGE European University alliance unites nine European higher education institutions situated in regions distant from central or metropolitan areas, sharing similar challenges such as demographic decline, an increasing immigrant and refugee population, low economic performance, low employment rates among marginalized communities, and strong specific cultural and linguistic identities.

These locational characteristics, combined with a comprehensive analysis of their territories and communities, define the alliance's shared objective: to design and test solutions and institutional models that empower marginalized areas and address common challenges. The research produced and the teaching provided by the alliance aim to serve society, particularly those communities and territories that experience marginalization.

To achieve this, students are taught to learn through service and to develop innovative solutions to societal challenges. The alliance offers students opportunities to live on modern, inclusive campuses and participate in transformative internships and mobility experiences. Additionally, it emphasizes the value of individual and family heritage languages and cultures, which are particularly significant in diverse communities located at geographical margins.

In 2024, Matej Bel University in Banská Bystrica joined the EMERGE European University Alliance alongside eight other universities from various regions of Europe. Securing funding for a joint project aimed at improving the quality of life in European regions with significant cultural diversity marked the culmination of long-term cooperation.

Through EMERGE, Matej Bel University is set to gain significant development opportunities across multiple areas, particularly in advancing internationalization and strengthening its societal engagement. The consortium is currently engaged in several joint initiatives, including the TRIP project, which focuses on promoting innovative educational methods. In the near future, the consortium's efforts will also prioritize building a network of external partner institutions from practical sectors.

Before the official launch of the EMERGE European University Alliance project on January 1, 2025, a management meeting involving all nine partners was held. This meeting assessed the preparatory phase of the project across all work packages. Matej Bel University is leading the work package dedicated to community engagement and co-leading the work package focused on co-creating knowledge to address local challenges.



ENLIGHT is a European University alliance of ten comprehensive, research-intensive universities from ten European countries, training over 300,000 learners per year and sharing a deep commitment to social responsibility. Alliance aims to conduct an impact-driven and challenge-based transformation of European higher education to empower learners as globally engaged citizens with state-of-the-art knowledge and skills, while synergising our R&I potential with and for our societal partners, to tackle major societal transitions and to promote equitable quality of life and sustainability.

By joining forces, ENLIGHT aims to establish an open integrated space for our learners, teachers and researchers to study, learn and work together, enabling the free movement of students and staff and lifelong access to the best education environment, to connect R&I capacity and maximise impact by systemic sharing of resources.

A prime example of ENLIGHT's impact is CU's upcoming Double Degree Programme with the University of Bordeaux. Set to launch soon, this Programme allows management students to study at both institutions, earning degrees from each. This initiative highlights the benefits of ENLIGHT's collaboration, offering students international education and professional opportunities.

In 2024, ENLIGHT launched its first Grant Calls to support joint education projects and challenge-based activities linking education, research, and providing for outreach across the alliance.

Comenius University Bratislava (CU) has been part of ENLIGHT since its launch in 2020, following selection under the second pilot call of the European University initiative. ENLIGHT alliance includes over 325,000 students and 60,000 staff across its ten institutions. Since its inception, the alliance has developed 50+ joint courses and facilitated more than 4,000 student mobilities.

In recognition of its innovative approaches, including challenge-based education and local partnerships, Comenius University Bratislava received the prestigious ENLIGHT Teaching and Learning Award in 2024 for its course Policy Making in Slovakia. Newly formed Green Office closely collaborates with students to integrate sustainable practices into Comenius University.

An important aspect of the alliance is cooperation with external stakeholders. Through CU Regional Academy, Comenius University works with partners like Bratislava City Council, ESET, Clowndoctors, Public Defender of Rights, thus fostering lifelong learning and developing challenge-based education.

The ENLIGHT University alliance is represented at Comenius University by the Department for the ENLIGHT University alliance. Within ENLIGHT, there is a Student Network and a Student Board, which consist of student representatives from all participating universities. Students are not only the primary beneficiaries of the advantages but also co-creators of the ENLIGHT initiative.

To achieve this goal, alliance have defined a guiding principle and chosen a clear focus based on sustainability: integrating knowledge from science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) with social sciences and humanities (SSH) to develop solutions for major societal challenges, particularly climate change and risks to social cohesion.

The INVEST alliance unites 64,949 students, 4,508 staff, and 41 faculties across six partner institutions to foster sustainability, innovation, and inclusiveness. Focused on the Water, Energy, Food, and Environment Nexus, Quality of Life, and Entrepreneurship, INVEST aims to empower a new generation of Europeans to lead sustainable practices.

INVEST integrates real-world challenges into education through Living Labs, where students apply knowledge in practical projects, benefiting society. It offers ten Bachelor Specializations in sustainability and regional development, requiring study at partner universities and providing cultural and language training. Graduates earn an INVEST Certificate alongside their diploma.

For staff, the Fellow Programme and a train-the-trainer initiative provide professional development and foster collaboration. Two Master's degrees in sustainable urban development and crisis management further support regional sustainability goals.

The alliance's Virtual Campus and EDUC8EU, an AI-based academic advising tool, enhance collaboration and streamline access to shared study materials, degrees, and mobility opportunities. A unified academic calendar synchronizes activities across institutions.

The INVEST Research and Innovation Board drives research excellence, leveraging shared infrastructure and engaging stakeholders through the quadruple helix model—integrating academia, industry, government, and society. This approach supports the creation of a Centre of Excellence for Research, Development, and Innovation to address sustainability challenges.

By merging education, research, and regional cooperation, INVEST prepares students and staff to shape a sustainable future for Europe while strengthening ties between partner institutions and their communities.

KreativEU (Knowledge & Creativity European University) is an alliance of higher education institutions across Europe committed to establishing a fully European university. Its mission is to leverage European cultural heritage, research, and knowledge transfer to address societal challenges and foster a sustainable future. By integrating cultural and ecological heritage into education, KreativEU aims to promote positive transformations in local, regional, and global contexts.

Launched in April 2021, KreativEU initially included seven universities, such as the Polytechnic University of Tomar (Portugal - alliance coordinator) and Trnava University in Trnava (Slovakia). These institutions share a commitment to preserving eco-cultural heritage, digitization, and environmental sustainability. Collaborative efforts have since expanded the alliance to 11 universities, incorporating partners from Germany, Italy, Sweden, Poland, and the Netherlands.

The alliance is founded on a shared vision of the importance of European cultural and artistic diversity as a driving force for cohesion, equality, peace, sustainability, and educational, economic, political, social, and scientific innovation and development. It contributes to creating a unique European university capable of offering a competitive and attractive European education and research system. In this system, students, researchers, academics, and society as a whole collaborate across cultures, national borders, and academic disciplines.

Key achievements of the alliance include securing funds for the HERITAGE GAME project (2024–2026), which develops gamification tools for heritage conservation in low-density areas. The launch of the Erasmus Mundus master's program Multi-Heritage 2024 further underscores KreativEU's dedication to academic innovation.

Through its flagship PIONEER+ project (2025–2028), the Alliance is dedicated to addressing critical issues of urban planning and development, with an emphasis on achieving Sustainable Development Goal 11 (SDG11: Sustainable Cities and Communities).
